Herb	Type	Cultivar	Description	SMSF Zone
<u>Basil</u>	Asian basil	<u>Sweet Thai</u>	Attractive potted herb or edible bedding plant, this basil is a flavorful garnish for Thai dishes.	A B
<u>Basil</u>	Genovese basil	<u>Elidia</u>	A more compact habit makes this basil ideal for a container. Slower to bolt and resistant to the Fusarium wilt fungus.	A B
<u>Catmint</u>		<u>Walker's Low</u>	Compact catmint with felty, gray leaves. Fragrant, dark periwinkle blue flowers cover the shrub all summer and early fall. Drought tolerant. The Perennial Plant of the Year for 2007.	A B C
<u>Cilantro</u>		<u>Calypso</u>	Invaluable herb for culinary use and an essential of Mexican, Indian, Asian, and many other cuisines. Prolific, and slow to bolt for longer, higher yield. Grows well in containers as well as in the garden. Harvest leaves once plants are established and before flowering begins. For coriander seeds, thin plants to 2-4" apart. Mature seeds are produced about 3 months after planting. Let seeds dry on the plant before harvesting.	A B C
<u>Parsley</u>	Flat-leaf parsley	<u>Peione</u>	Improved Giant of Italy-type parsley with larger and darker green leaves with sweeter flavor. High leaf mass on thick, upright stems for easier harvest. Biennial. If planted in well-drained location, can be overwintered to produce again the next spring.	A B C
<u>Parsley</u>	Curly-leaf parsley	<u>Darki</u>	Very dark green curly parsley for garnishes, salads and cooking. Harvest outer leaves to allow heart of the plant to produce more leaves. Biennial. If planted in well-drained location, can be overwintered to produce again the next spring. Grows well in containers.	A B C
<u>Russian Sage</u>		<u>Russian Sage</u>	Light lavender-blue flowers bloom in July, and often last throughout September. Its silver-gray, deeply cut foliage and stiff stems attract bees and butterflies to the garden. Drought tolerant, once established.	A B C
